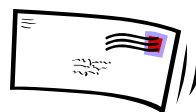

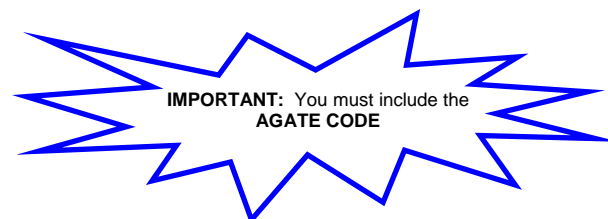
Student Procedures

1. Secure SAT student's application form entitled **SAT Paper Registration Guide** from your high school counselor. If you are in a rural district without a high school, call your nearest high school and/or school counselor for application forms.
2. **Check your deadline dates** in the SAT Registration Bulletin.
Oct 1, Oct 30, Dec 15
Registration must be made in advance for the following test dates. **Nov 7, Dec 5, Jan 23**
3. Testing must be completed by **January 31, 2010**. Later testing dates are not appropriate for this competition.

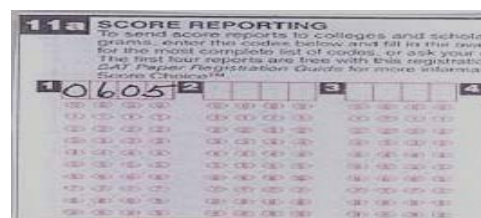
4. Register to take the **SAT 1: Reasoning Test.**



SAT exception: You cannot register on-line if you are younger than 13.



5. Choose a **testing site** that is close to you.
6. The cost of the test is **\$45.00** paid directly to the College Board. Montana AGATE **does not require a fee.**
7. Put High School Code in # 5. This will allow for 2nd copy in case a report becomes lost. The AGATE code number is **0605**. Put the Code **0605** in 11 A. This code number assures that the results are sent to MT AGATE.

8. **Circle # 3:** Female or Male
Circle #6: Current Grade Level. This information is needed for the **Interpretive Guide.**
9. Complete the exercises in the **SAT Practice Test/SAT Practice Booklet** or the **SAT Practice Test** online for free.

Younger than 13

Due to Internet privacy laws, students younger than 13 years of age **cannot** register online. To register for the SAT, obtain an **SAT Paper Registration Guide** from your local high school, complete the enclosed registration form and submit with payment.

Keeping Scores

If you test in the 7th or 8th grade, your scores are removed from your file at the end of the year that you tested. If you don't want your scores removed, you must let College Program know before June of the year you tested. Send your request to keep scores, including your full identification information, registration number, and test date to *The College Board SAT Program, Attention: Talent Search Scores, P. O. Box 025505, Miami, FL 33102*

7th & 8th Grade Students

We invite you to participate in the **2009-2010 SAT Challenge** conducted by **Montana AGATE** (Association of Gifted and Talented Education). We are looking for academically able and highly motivated seventh and eighth grade students who wish to gain additional insight into their future educational opportunities.

1. **Grade:** You must be in the seventh or eighth grade for the 2009-2010 school year

2. **Test Scores:** You should have scored at the 95th percentile or better on the national norms in at least one of the following sections or subtests of standardized aptitude or achievement tests - Total Math, Total Verbal, or Total Battery.

3. **Alternatives:** If standardized test scores are not available, consider GPA Lists (A average or 3.5 GPA), Honor Roll Lists, and/or National Junior Honor Society Membership. Assistance from G/T or Enrichment Program Coordinators, Middle School "Teams", Faculty, Counselors, and/or Special Program Coordinators may be helpful in determining eligibility.

Eligibility
To be eligible, you must meet the first requirement and consider the second/third listed items

Student Benefits

1. You will have a **challenging experience** which will compare your abilities with those of other highly able seventh and eighth graders.
2. You will receive information needed to interpret your scores from SAT and an **Interpretive Guide** from MT AGATE.

*In the past some student score reports **have not been** sent directly to Mrs. Speake. Please contact her if you feel that your child/student has not been included as an honoree.*

3. **Scholarship awards** will be presented. First place winners will each receive \$200.00 for critical reading, math, and/or writing scores. The award is to be used to advance your learning.
4. You and your school district will receive the winner's results. Winners will receive interpretation of scores from Montana AGATE.

Students with winning scores will be honored at an awards ceremony and each will receive a T-shirt and a cap (sponsored by **Montana State University**), and an AGATE certificate. The ceremony will be held on

April 15-17, 2010

at the AGATE Conference in Billings, MT. Students may have the opportunity to participate in the **Student Day Activities**.

5. **News releases** will be sent directly to the winners, and they in turn will submit the notification to **local newspapers** and their respective **schools**.
